A pair of Vienna porcelain cachepot, second half 18th century, of gently flared cylindrical form, enamelled with sprays of Deutsche Blumen against a wrythen moulded ground, the basketweave moulded rims with scroll moulded detail heightened with puce enamelling, raised on four scroll feet, underglaze blue shield mark, puce painted '19' to one and some incised marks to bases, height 12cm (minor faults).

Condition Report

1509. Both generally in good condition. One pot with two small chips to exterior rim edge. Each foot has a number of sizeable chips and losses. The other pot has one small chip to exterior rim edge, another to the interior rim edge. One foot with sizeable chip to left side, another with small chip to right side.
