A Meissen porcelain inkwell, circa 1730, of square shape, decorated in the manner of J.G. Höroldt with a harbour scene to each side within gilt framing and iron red detail, each side edge with polychrome enamelled detail, the upper surface with gilded scrollwork, crossed swords in blue to base, height 4.7cm (lacking cover, chip to base edge).

Estimate: £400 - £600

Condition Report

1453. Small flat manufacturers chip to footrim which has been glazed over, minor firing crack alongside. Other minor nicks and blemishes to corners and base edges (most since manufacture). Flat chip and blemish to one top corner. Lacking well and cover. Gilding to top surface quite rubbed and completely worn in some spots beneath panels near base edge. No restoration.
