A Pountney & Allies blue printed earthenware meat platter, circa 1816-35, with a central scene of 'Chepstow Castle' from the Bristol View Series, blue printed and impressed marks to base, length 32.5cm, together with a group of similar blue printed platters and plates, including a Spode Tower pattern platter and a Ridgway & Co Marmora pattern plate (some faults).

Condition Report

1474. Pountney & Allies dish - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Some light staining patches visible to reverse, but nothing particularly significant. Small Spode dish - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Small dish with bridge - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Light crazing. Copeland dish - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Spode dish with same floral pattern - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs, but some wear to edges and some light discolouration and crazing. Copeland tureen stand - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Italian flower garden pattern circular stand - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Lake of Como pattern plate - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Slight crazing and light staining. Ridgway Mamora plate - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Wedgwood plate - broken in two and re-glued, and chip to rim. Royal Persian sideplate - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Similar Chinese pattern plate - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Ridgways 'Oriental' plate - chip to rim, crazed and stained.
