A Pilkington's Royal Lancastrian lustre vase, circa 1907, by Charles E. Cundall, monogrammed, the ovoid body and short narrow neck decorated with sailing ships flanked by foliage against a cream ground, impressed factory marks and '2445' with painted artist's monogram to base, height 12cm (minor restoration).

Condition Report

4103. Overall typical fine crazing to glaze. The circumference of the neck rim has been professionally restored and sprayed. There appears to also be some clear spraying to the underside of the foot over the mark and around the footrim which appears to be over a minor haircrack just visible amidst the crazing.
