A Continental porcelain cased mantel clock, late 19th century, with eight day movement striking on a bell, the balloon shaped case surmounted with a shepherdess and lamb above a pair of cupids, otherwise with dense flower encrusting and pierced flowerhead and lattice panels, on a rococo scroll moulded base, green printed anchor mark and inscribed 'Exposition de Paris 1878' to inside of base, height 49cm, with pendulum (minor chips and losses).

## Condition Report

1469. Overall in good order considering its size and intricacy . Dial with flat chip to edge beneath 5 o'clock, another to edge between 3 and 4 o'clock and smaller chip by 7 o'clock. Black painted retailer's mark to dial is worn, can just read 'New York'. Both back feet with chips, predominantly left foot. Cupids are in good order. Shepherdess missing left thumb. Overall typical losses to applied detail, only really noticeable on closer inspection.
