A pair of Staffordshire porcelain three-tier stands, mid-19th century, each decorated with scattered floral sprigs and sprays within gilt enriched scroll rims, separated by baluster shaped sections and raised on shell, scroll and acanthus moulded feet, unmarked, height 53cm (faults to one), together with a similar navette shaped pierced porcelain basket and a Paris porcelain part service, comprising two stands, two pierced dishes and two plates (minor faults).

Estimate: £100 - £200

Condition Report

4184. First stand - in good condition overall with no cracks or restoration, teeny tiny chip to top edge of lower column support - only noticeable on close inspection. Gilding and enamels remain bright and strong with no real wear.

Second stand - top column support is badly broken with losses, otherwise in good condition overall. Gilding and enamels remain bright and strong with no real wear.

Basket - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Paris set - one stand with a couple of very minor chips and indistinct hairlines, really nothing to worry about too much, otherwise both stands in good condition with no restoration and minimal typical wear to gilding. One pierced dish with minor nick to rim edge, otherwise both in good condition. Pair of plates in good condition with wear.
