LOT 89

A group of Chinese silver items, mostly early 20th century, including a cylindrical cane handle, decorated in relief with dragons, length 6.1cm, a tripod vessel (lacking handle) and figures (some faults).

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

89. Cane handle - typical small dents around top and light surface wear. Some misshaping to rim. Wood broken off inside handle. No maker's mark.

Tripod vessel - missing handle, otherwise good condition, marked to base.

Dish - good condition, marked to base interior.

Sedan chair - good condition, with mark to base.

Sedan chair - good condition, with mark to base.

Sedan chair with two figures - one arm rest to chair broken and missing, otherwise ok. No mark.

Boat - good condition, some misshaping to rope work. No mark.

Standing street vendor - good condition, mark to base.

Beheading figure - good condition, no mark.

Figure behind bars - some misshaping/tears around panel around his neck, otherwise good condition, no mark.

Punishment figure - good condition, minor misshaping, no mark.

Dragon handle (?) - it is in generally good condition but does not have legs on the other side and does not seem to have ever had legs as no signs of damage or loss. Maker's mark 'WH' to one foot, presumably Wang Hing.

Total weight 284.9g and the cane handle.
