An aesthetic porcelain jardinière, late 19th century, possibly by Moore Brothers, of tapering cylindrical form, decorated in silver and gilt with birds amongst reeds and peonies, between pierced Greek key borders flanked by pierced handles, indistinct registration lozenge to base, height 23.5cm (faults).

Condition Report

1504. The figure seems to have been broken into a number of large pieces due to three large fireing cracks to the base, these cracks radiate through the figure and have repainted restoration along them. There are therefore areas of old deteriorating restoration throughout the figure, eg. putti's right foot, left foot and top of leg, across top of column through drapery, muse's left arm, right hand and through neck.
