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A Chinese yellow ground silk embroidered robe brocade panel, early Qing dynasty, probably 17th century, the central quatrelobed panel finely worked in coloured threads with dragons, flaming pearls and vapours, reserved against a brocade cloud ground, the borders with further dragons, flaming pearls and vapours above waves, 235cm x 124cm.

Condition Report

1200. Silk panel is two pieces from a larger panel which have then been joined together. Obviously the panels have been joined along the middle and as you can see from the images one of the dragons does not have a complete head. There is significant fraying and war to the silk particularly around the edges. Also some tears where the silk has worn. Typical wear commensurate with age, otherwise colours are still fairly good.

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
