LOT 1434

A mixed group of English early 19th century and later porcelain teawares, including a London shape teacup and saucer, probably Coalport, painted with a continuous border of birds between foliate gilt and cobalt blue rims, diameter of saucer 14.1cm, a Ridgway teacup and saucer with leaf moulded sides in shades of green and yellow, heightened in gilt, and Derby and Crown Staffordshire examples (minor faults).

Condition Report

1434. Coalport cup/saucer - couple of nibbles to the rim of cup, area of white household paint/residue near handle, crazing and slight staining to both.

Ridgway leaf cup/saucer - minor gilding losses.

Pale orange/cobalt blue floral cup/saucer - typical surface wear.

Blue/gilt cup/saucer - ok.

Orange/gilt cup/saucer - both crazed.

Green banded floral cup/saucer - staining to cup, heavy wear to saucer.

Crown Staffordshire cup/saucer - both cracked.

Pink basket of flowers cup/saucer - cup crazed.

Cobalt blue Landscapes cup/saucer - wear to saucer, crazed, chip to underside.

Gilt crane cup/saucer - minor gilding losses.

Green/white lattice cup/saucer - cup heavily stained, gilding losses to saucer.

Derby cup/saucer - cup crack to handle, heavy wear to saucer.

Derby saucer - some wear to gilding, crazed.

Spode saucer - minor wear to gilding.

Floral/gilt cup - stained, cracked.
