

LOT 1157 23rd May 2019

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A late 19th century French gilt spelter and porcelain mantel clock garniture, the clock with eight day movement striking on a bell via an outside countwheel, the dial with Roman numerals on a puce ground framing a cherub, the case with urn surmount above columns and a breakfront base, height 38.5cm, flanked by a pair of matching urns and covers (lacking pendulum).

Estimate: £100 - £150

Condition Report

1157. This is a spelter clock that requires gilding, the case is much rubbed with metal showing through. There is no pendulum with the clock so it cannot be tested if it will run. Both springs are connected and it will wind up. All case parts are intact and it is complete. Some parts loose but only require retightening. All porcelain panels are sound but show some gilt rubbing and numerous jewels missing. The two garnitures are complete and undamaged but in similar condition to the clock. No key and no pendulum.

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
