A pair of late 18th/early 19th century Continental carved ivory figures of putti, one modelled holding a bunch of grapes aloft, the other holding a dagger to the mouth of a snake, both mounted on ebonized circular bases, height 27cm.

Estimate: £400 - £600

Condition Report

2514. The figure with the snake has some overall natural occurring surface cracks running through the body and base, but otherwise is in good order.

The figure with the grapes has a small chip to the edge of the top vine leaf by his hand. His right foot has been broken and repaired, resulting in being re-fixed to the base and with some glue residue around both feet. The figure is slightly loosely attached to the carved base. Otherwise similar surface cracks as the other figure. Total weight of both cherubs = 1484g.
