Condition Report

Vase 1 - 7.5cm x 2.5cm corner section of rim broken and re-glued. Numerous small chips to rim and fritting to glaze on rim. Otherwise the neck and body are in good condition. Minor chips and wear to corners of the base and typical wear to gilt and enamels.

Vase 2 - one corner of the rim has numerous chips and other small chips around the rim. Typical glaze fritting to rim and some of corners/edges on the neck and body. Otherwise generally good order with typical wear to gilt and enamels.
