A small collection of Chinese pottery, mostly 19th century, including a white crackle glazed bottle vase, height 7.3cm, a turquoise glazed bottle vase, height 18cm, a turquoise glazed cockerel, height 10.5cm, and a famille rose teacup, height 6.7cm, together with a Japanese blue and white reticulated hexagonal pot, height 8.5cm.

Condition Report

1032. White crackle glazed bottle vase - small chip to exterior edge of foot.

Turquoise bottle vase - heavily crazed, small glaze chip to exterior rim edge, chipping to footrim.

Cockerel - chip and minor chip or fritting to footrim, crazed.

Famille rose teacup - small chip to upper rim edge opposite handle, gilded rim totally rubbed. Surface wear to enamels.

Reticulated pot - good condition.

Red glazed vase - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

Two handle blue and white vase - converted to lampbase so drilled to side and plaster filled to top. Two large chips to exterior rim edge.

Blue and white vase and cover - cover badly chipped.

Famille rose bowl - badly cracked and restored.

Brown glazed dish - good condition.

Two covers - smaller extensively chipped, larger chipped and repaired.
