## LOT 2561

An unusual 19th century horn and brass framed rectangular box, the hinged lid inset with a blue dip jasperware plaque within a surround of cut steel borders, the corners also studded in cut steel, width 14cm.

Estimate: £100 - £150

## **Condition Report**

2561. Currently the lid panel is loose and detached from its brass frame, there is some glue residue visible around the edges as well as some minor loss to corners. The top panel has several small marcasite studs missing on the right side, otherwise ok. The brass frame is generally quite sound with just some minor surface wear and scratches. The horn panels are all slightly crazed and the rear panel has a small crack to one side, possibly having a later additional brass panel applied to the inside, to help support the horn panel.
