LOT 1034

A group of Chinese export porcelain, 18th century and later, including a pair of famille rose teabowls, painted with opposing figural panels against a gilt scroll ground, reserved with smaller floral and landscape panels, diameter 7.3cm, an Imari teabowl, a provincial blue and white saucer dish, diameter 9.5cm, a pair of Canton celadon ground dishes, diameter 24.5cm, and a Canton plate, diameter 20.5cm (faults).

Condition Report

1034. Pair tea bowls - one with one tiny nick to top rim edge, other with extensive small chips/nicks to rim edge circumference and small nick to footrim. Typical light wear to both.

Imari tea bowl - 0.5cm square flat chip to rim edge exterior and three smaller nicks to rim edge. Gilding heavily rubbed, surface scratches to interior.

Provincial saucer - some Chinese text characters scratched into well which has typical light surface scratches.

Pair dishes - first with 4cm hairline to rim at 4 o'clock and three chips to rim edge - largest 1.5cm. Small chip to footrim. Second has 0.5cm square flat chip to rim underside edge and a number of tiny nicks with small firing blemish to rim. Both with typically rubbed gilded rims and minor wear.

Plate - 1cm by 1.5cm glued chip to underside rim edge with minor spot of loss. Typical minor surface wear.
