Condition Report

1086. It is definitely old, but we believe it was originally a jar and cover. The handles have been broken off and a later, but still old, silver rim and handles have been added. The porcelain has two cracks emanating from beneath the rim at one handle and a small crack beneath the rim at the other handle. You can just about see where the original handles would have been, but almost entirely disguised by new handle mounts. Otherwise the rest of the body and foot in good order and the decoration is good vibrant colours.
