A George I walnut and marquetry inlaid chest-on-stand, the top profusely inlaid with a central urn and a double-headed eagle, all supported with scolling foliage and flowerheads, the two short and four long drawers similarly decorated, raised on associated cabriole legs, height 123cm, width 105cm, depth 58cm (alterations).

## Condition Report

2130. General overall minor repairs to sections of veneer throughout, back edge and corners of top, a few sections of moulding around edges and some sections of inlay. There are some cracks across the top panel, loose section of moulding to right hand edge. Handles and escutcheons are replacements and there are small in-filled holes either side of the handles. The drawers are pine-lined and the locks are old, but probably not original. The base drawer section is clearly original, but would probably have been raised on legs with a united stretcher. The two cabriole legs have quite a lot of age, but the rear legs are clearly quite a lot later.
