A late Victorian diamond, opal and ruby brooch, circa 1900, designed as a winged insect perched on an arrow, mounted with a pear shaped opal to the body and a cushion cut ruby to the arrowhead, otherwise set with cushion and rose cut diamonds, width 5.4cm.

Estimate: £200 - £300

Condition Report

664. The opal to the body of the insect has slight surface wear. The principal diamond to the insect slightly draws colour but looks to be a fairly clear stone. The insect and the arrow are a bit bent and the brooch pin is rather bent by the hinge. The brooch mount is a bit discoloured and would benefit from careful professional cleaning.

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
