## LOT 1013

A Chinese Canton famille rose porcelain vase, mid to late 19th century, the ovoid body painted with opposing figural panels reserved against a group of dense flowers, beneath a similarly decorated flared neck with applied Buddhist lion cub handles and two pairs of chilong to shoulders, height 44 cm (hairline crack to body and minor chips).

Estimate: £200 - £300

## Condition Report

1013. Long vertical haircrack starts from halfway down neck and then runs for approx 24cm down into body, otherwise vase in generally good order with a few minor chips, e.g., neck of one chilong and tail of one buddhistic lion. Some flaking to enamels of figural panels.
