A Chelsea porcelain Kakiemon plate, circa 1755, painted with the Flying Fox pattern, red painted anchor mark and Shelton Collection applied paper label, diameter 24.5cm (faults), together with a Chelsea strawberry moulded plate, painted with a bird, red painted anchor mark, diameter 23cm (riveted), a Chelsea Derby plate, painted with cherries and butterflies, red painted anchor mark, diameter 23cm (chipped), and another, painted with Deutsche Blumen, unmarked, diameter 22.5cm.

Condition Report

1561. Flying Fox - overall black pitting/speckling to glaze with long firing crack to cavetto of plate. Enamels worn overall with staking wear to surface glaze to raised points of cavetto. Chips to upper rim edge at 6 and 10 o'clock, minor nicks at 2, 3 and 5 o'clock.

Strawberry plate with bird - badly cracked and riveted. Light surface wear/scratches to enamels.

Plate with cherries - firing crack and chip to footrim, faint short hairline visible to rim underside, number of nibbles and chips to circumference of rim. Typical surface scratches and wear.

Floral plate - overall quite significant surface wear and wear/scratches to decoration, with overall black pitting to glaze. Number of chips to circumference of rim with short haircrack to one of the more significant chips.
