A pearlware blue painted small teapot and cover, late 18th century, the globular body painted in blue with a chinoiserie landscape, height 11cm (restored), together with two similar teapots and covers with blue printed decoration (minor faults and restoration). Note: the first teapot is illustrated by Lois Roberts in 'Painted in Blue', published by The Northern Ceramic Society, p.134, fig. 231. Here it is noted that the circle and dot border is uncommon. Provenance: from the collection of Jennifer Moody.

Condition Report

1528. Circle and dot border - cover with minor spot of filled professional restoration to edge. Pot with small chip to footrim, professionally restored top end of spout, typical crazing and 2 minor vertical hairlines to rim. Larger printed teapot - rim edge of cover professionally restored. Pot typically crazed with restoration to tip of spout and both handle terminals, small chip to footrim. Smaller printed teapot - cover badly chipped, minor fritting to tip of spout and footrim.
