LOT 1178

A Chinese sang-de-boeuf glazed porcelain brush washer, 20th century, of compressed circular form, height 4.5cm, together with a collection of Chinese and Japanese pottery, including a Japanese blue and white bowl, length 12.5cm, a Satsuma cylindrical jar, height 7cm (lacking cover), and a Satsuma ovoid vase (some faults).

Condition Report

1178. Sang-de-boeuf brush washer - in good condition with no cracks, chips or restoration. Intentional crazing to glaze. A few very insignificant surface scratches to glaze.

Blue and white tureen base - number of vertical firing cracks to rim, longest approx 2.5cm, otherwise ok.

Diminutive blue and white vase - extensively broken into a number of pieces and visibly repaired with hole to body on one side amidst break lines.

Satsuma jar - lacking cover, glued repairs to 2 feet, typical crazing to glaze.

Blue ground Satsuma vase - typical crazing to glaze, small chip to rim edge of neck.

Trembleuse saucer - chipping and fritting to circumference of rim, gilding worn, some wear to enamels.

Blue and gilt vase - vertical fine haircrack to body running from top rim to just above the footrim, with another long fine haircrack running from it diagonally across the widest part of the body. Gilding rubbed to varying degrees over the body of the vase.

3 bowls - one with a number of haircracks emanating from chips to the rim, the other two generally ok with frits/chipping to the rim circumference. Each with wear to gilding and enamels.
