## Condition Report

In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

There are some long craze lines just about visible around the foot and there are typical light surface scratches to the body overall - primarily the widest part - but these are very insignificant and only noticeable on very close inspection. There is a pinhead sized manufacturers burst air bubble to the rim edge exterior - just about visible on the third image of our website using the zoom function.

The colouring of the vase is beautiful.
