A pair of Italian maiolica small berettino albarelli or pill jars, Faenza, mid-18th century, both of waisted form, inscribed 'SEM:DI:IVSQV' and 'SEM:D:AMEOS' within painted labels against a ground of flowers and foliage picked out in yellow and ochre, each with scattered insects, the first with two cockerels too, height 14cm (minor chips). Provenance: from the collection of the late Professor Maurice Stacey.

Condition Report

Both have a small chip to the top edge of the foot approx 5mm long by 3mm wide and two very minor glaze frits to the top rim edge, otherwise they are in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.
