### LOT 1305

A large pair of Italian maiolica albarelli, of Castelli type, late 19th/early 20th century, the baluster bodies polychrome painted with a female or male saint, one inscribed 'ELECT: CASSIA', the other 'AQ: FLO: AUR:', surrounded by flowers and foliage in blue outlined in black, height 30.5cm (faults). Provenance: from the collection of the late Professor Maurice Stacey.

Estimate: £60 - £100

### Condition Report

Male saint - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, some minor fritting and manufacturer's flaws to glaze and body.

Female saint - glued chip to outer edge of foot approx 4cm long which has 2 long haircracks running at a 45 degree angle from it in opposite directions - one runs into the hem of the saints clothing, the other runs into the stem and leaves of the large flower opposing the saint. Some minor fritting and manufacturer's flaws to glaze and body.
