## LOT 1165

An early 19th century large mahogany circular drop dial wall timepiece with brass four pillar eight day single fusee movement, the 17-inch painted wood dial with black Roman hour numerals and indistinctly inscribed 'Dwerrrihouse & Carter London', within a moulded circular surround with cast brass bezel, the apron with hinged door, diameter 50cm, with pendulum and winding key and case keys (faults). Note: Dwerrrihouse & Carter are recorded in 'Watchmakers and Clockmakers of the World' by Brian Loomes as working in London between 1802 and 1823.

Estimate: £300 - £500

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## Condition Report

1165. The clock is not in particularly good condition and would certainly require restoration/repair to return it to its best. The painted wood dial is crazed and worn with some paint loss and overpainting. The mahogany surround is in generally good condition with only typical knocks etc, but no significant damage. The glass is good. The case back has had a re-glued break to the left side door and surround with further cracks and splits above and below. Other side with split to top back edge. Otherwise apron in good order with typical wear and scuffs.

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
