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A George III mahogany bracket clock with eight day twin fusee movement striking hours on a bell with pull repeat mechanism, the backplate with foliate engraved decoration, the painted breakarch dial signed 'WM Robson London', flanked by subsidiary date and strike/silent dials to arch, above black Roman hours and outer Arabic minutes, the case with triple pad top and brass carrying handle above a moulded arch pediment and glazed doors, the sides with pierced brass scale fret panels, on a moulded plinth base, height 42.5cm, with pendulum. Note: William Robson is recorded in 'Watchmakers and Clockmakers of the World' by Brian Loomes as a clockmaker working in London (Cripplegate) between 1800 and 1821.

Condition Report

1118. The clock is in generally good restored condition.

The mahogany case has no significant damage or repairs, but has typical veneer splits, scuffs etc.

The dial has light crazing with some slightly more unstable areas where there are sings of some minor lifting to paintwork.

The movement winds smoothly and is currently running but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch. The strike mechanism is also working as it should.

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
