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A Regency mahogany bracket clock with eight day twin fusee movement striking on a bell, the painted circular convex dial with black Roman numerals and inscribed 'Vesper London', the brass inlaid case with pineapple finial above brass framed recessed panels to front, flanked by a pair of gilt brass cornucopia and loose ring handles and pierced scale fret panels to sides, on a plinth base and brass ball feet, height 48cm, with pendulum.

Condition Report

1121. The clock is in generally good restored condition.

The case has typical splits to veneers particularly between 3 and 4 o'clock and at 7 and 8 o'clock. The dial has some light crazing to paintwork and under closer inspection some small areas of minor paint lifting/bubbling.

Unfortunately we are unable to get into the clock despite trying hundreds of keys. Neither the back door or glazed front will open, so unable to give any further details on whether it runs etc. Looking through the back door it is apparent that, like the rest of the clock, there has been restoration, however there are no obvious signs of alterations.

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
