A Meissen floral encrusted teacup and saucer, late 19th century, the cup exterior with applied long stems of white flowers and painted scattered insects, the saucer painted to the well with scattered insects around a central blossom branch, the underside applied with flowers and foliage, crossed swords in underglaze blue to bases, diameter of saucer 13.6cm, together with a Meissen saucer, painted and applied with blue forget-me-nots, diameter 13.4cm, and another floral encrusted teacup and saucer (faults and losses).

Estimate: £120 - £180

Condition Report

1498. Cup and saucer with applied white flowers - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. The cup is missing one petal of one flower but otherwise the applied flowers and foliage are in good order overall with only minor typical losses/chips.

Saucer with blue forget-me-nots - missing one section of applied stem but otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration but typical minor losses to applied flowers.

Cup and saucer with blue forget-me-nots - saucer heavily crazed with light staining and long haircrack from rim to centre of saucer with small triangular shaped loss to starting point on rim, and a couple of other much smaller firing cracks to rim. Considerable losses to applied detail on saucer, less significant losses to applied detail on cup.
