LOT 1505

A Meissen porcelain yellow ground tea for two, late 19th century, enamelled with floral panels, comprising a teapot and cover with floral finial and swan spout, a sugar bowl and cover, two teacups and saucers and a slop bowl, crossed swords in underglaze blue to bases, height of teapot 10cm (faults and repairs).

Estimate: £120 - £180

Condition Report

1505. Teapot and cover - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. A few minor and light surface scratches, some minor wear to gilding on edge of cover.

Slop bowl - in good condition overall with no cracks or restoration. There is a tiny nick to the exterior rim edge amongst the gilding and a manufacturers glazed over blemish to the outer edge of the footrim. The interior sides are heavily scratched with wear and light staining to the base interior enamels - almost as though it has been used to put a tight fitting plant pot in.

Pot and cover - pot with large section broken away in one piece and visibly riveted. The cover has an approx 0.5cm square flat chip to the upper edge and some black pitting to the yellow ground, the finial is also missing part of its stem and leaf with chips to its petals.

Two cups - both in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. The gilt rim of each displays some wear and there are some minor areas of wear to the inner rim edge of each cup. Each footrim has some manufacturers blemishes.

Two saucers - both in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. The gilding on each rim has some light wear and there are some minor areas of wear to the inner rim edge of each saucer. Both have some glazed over manufacturers blemishes to the footrim.
