A mixed group of decorative ceramics, 20th century, including a David Sharp model of a blackbird, height 17.5cm, a Royal Worcester ivory ground jug, model No. 1229, height 18.5cm, a pair of Royal Doulton Dutch Harlem Series Ware two-handled vases, height 10cm, and a Doulton John Barleycorn character jug (minor faults).

Condition Report

Blackbird - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Pair Doulton Series Ware vases - one has crazing to the glaze and some staining, otherwise both in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Bunnykins oval dish - typical light surface scratches/wear, otherwise ok.

Worcester jug - minor nick to rim behind spout, typical light wear/rubbing to gilding of handle.

Radford vase - heavily crazed, otherwise ok.

Carlton Ware Rouge Royale vase - rouge ground heavily and densely scratched like it's been attacked with a brillo pad.

John Barleycorn - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, a few minor surface scratches.

Adams bowl - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, crazing to glaze.

Hornsea Posy - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, crazing to glaze.

Masons jug and triangular dish - both in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Masons cruets stand - heavily crazed, otherwise ok.

Ladle - heavily crazed, gilding rubbed.

Athos jug - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Beswick dish - small chip to underside rim edge of one corner and some minor staining to undersides of corners.

Mussel shell majolica dish - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, fine crazing to glaze.
