## LOT 1025

A Chinese blue and white porcelain vase, Kangxi period, the baluster body painted with a figural scene of four maidens and children in a fenced garden, height 25cm (reduced neck, cracks and converted to a table lamp).

Estimate: £200 - £300

## **Condition Report**

1025. The vase has obviously had its neck reduced and been drilled through the base and mounted as a table lamp. The wooden top and base appear to be glued into place as some glue residue is visible around the base area, this therefore means we can give a condition report on the porcelain body, but only the visible areas. We cannot report on the areas that cannot be seen.

There is a shallow 'U' shaped crack running from the rim down into the shoulder and then back up to the rim, this covers an area of approximately 5cm high and deepest point and 16cm in length. This section may have broken out and been re-glued.

Otherwise the body is in generally good order with no other apparent significant damage. Typical surface scratches and wear to glaze.
