### Condition Report

345. There are numerous small dents to the body. The tip of the spout has been damaged and there has been a solder repair where lower part of handle meets the body. There is an engraved foliate band, but no other engraved monograms, inscriptions etc. One of the cartouches does appear to have had an erasure and the area is a little thin. Hallmarks are rubbed, but still readable. Handle is secure with no wobble/movement. The hinge lid is in good order with no repairs, hinge is good and closes tightly, but there is a little bit of sideways movement and slight daylight to edge.
