Condition Report

347. One bonbon dish has a 5mm split to the rim, not very noticeable. Otherwise both in good condition with no other damage and no repairs. Typical minor surface scratches and would benefit from a clean. Good clear hallmarks. The case has wear and some loss to outer covering, but hinge and interior good. Cigarette box in generally good condition with a few minor dents to back edge of hinge lid and sides. Engraving still good, no inscriptions. Hallmarks slightly rubbed, but still perfectly readable. Hinge and interior good.

Cheroot holder in good condition.
