LOT 1325

A small group of Chinese blue and white porcelain, late 19th century, comprising two baluster vases and a cover, painted with dragons, heights 27.5cm and 23.5cm, a Canton cylindrical mug, height 11cm, a baluster vase, painted with pheasant and flowers, height 25.8cm, and a double gourd vase, height 13cm (faults).

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

1325, Vase and cover, 27.5cm high - 4.5cm hairline to rim and minor rim restoration, otherwise body is in good condition. Cover is restored and has losses to glaze of finial.

Dragon vase, 23.5cm high - small chips/fritting to glaze on rim and a hairline crack that runs from the foot up the majority of the length of the body.

Baluster vase with flared neck - neck broken and re-glued with further crack running off from the break. Needs restoration. Some staining to glaze.

Mug - restored small chip to rim with 4cm hairline running down from same point, otherwise good condition with no other damage or repairs. Typical surface scratches and wear to glaze.

Double gourd vase - 4.5cm crack and small chip to rim, otherwise body appears to be in good condition.
