A collection of Japanese porcelain, 18th century and later, including a Nabeshima blue and white rectangular dish, length 19.8cm, an Arita blue and white bowl of petal outline, painted with figures in landscape, height 7.6cm, other blue and white dishes and an Imari bowl (some faults).

Condition Report

1346. Larger rectangular blue and white dish - two small chips to rim and chip to one corner of footrim. Typical wear and scratches to glaze, but no other significant damage or repairs.

Smaller rectangular blue and white dish - chip to top rim, small chip to underside of rim on lower left corner. Typical surface scratches to glaze.

Square Imari bowl - broken in half and rivet repaired, otherwise typical surface scratches and wear.

Blue and white petal rimmed bowl - small gilt lacquer repair to small chip on rim. Otherwise good condition. Typical light surface scratches and wear.

Conical bowl - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical wear to interior enamels.

Small Imari bowl - 5.5cm hairline to rim, otherwise good condition. Typical wear and scratches.

Blue and white sauceboat - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

Small square dish - numerous small chips to corners and rim, otherwise ok.

Blue and white inkwell - chip to underside of outer rim and another two chips to outer rim. Inner rim with minor chips. Typical wear and scratches.

Blue and white teabowl and saucer - small chip to rim of bowl. Otherwise both pieces in good condition. Typical scratches and wear.

Shaped blue and white dish - repaired chips to corners and rim and typical scratches and wear.

Iron red decoration saucer - generally in good order. Typical wear to enamels and two small nicks/chips to rim. Eggshell saucer - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

Imari stand/cover - few minor chips to rim, otherwise good. Typical light wear to gilt and enamels.
