**LOT 1231**

A small collection of Japanese pottery, mostly Meiji period, including a Kutani porcelain cabaret tray, painted with butterflies and flowers, length 45cm, an Imari tokkuri (sake bottle), 18th century, painted with flower panels, height 16cm, a Kutani bowl with metal rim, diameter 27.5cm, and a pair of Imari vases, height 16cm (some faults).

**Condition Report**

1231. Tray - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light wear to gilt and enamels.

Imari flask - repaired chip to rim and minor chips to rim, otherwise ok. Typical light wear to gilt and surface scratches.

Pair of Imari jars - good condition, no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear. No covers.

Imari bottle vase - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical minor wear.

Kutani bowl - typical light crazing, otherwise appears to be generally good order. However, there is a fitted metal rim which would suggest the rim may have been chipped/damaged previously.

Sastsuma vase - small crack to rim, otherwise ok. Some wear to gilt and typical crazing.

Bowl & cover - bowl is cracked.
