## LOT 510

A gold, rose cut diamond, sapphire and enamel locket ring, possibly Austro-Hungarian, circa 1800, the hinged elliptical top mounted with a diamond and sapphire set standing figure on a red guilloche enamelled ground, revealing an oval compartment, each shoulder formed as an enamelled angelic figure with a rose cut diamond headdress, the shank with foliate engraved decoration, weight 4.3g, ring size approx L1/2.

Estimate: £800 - £1,200

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## Condition Report

510. The sapphire is of medium colour saturation and has a few inclusions. The three rose cut diamonds slightly draw colour and have inclusions. Damage to red enamel work and further minor damage to the enamel of the shoulder figures and to the central figure. Old pawnbrokers scratch code marks within the band. Glazing intact to locket lower section, however the frame and glazing to the locket within the hinged lid is missing. Also evidence of lead solder within the lid stabilising the central figure motif from the back. Number ♦554♦ scratched to the underside of the back of the locket compartment. The hinge of the locket is in good condition. The metal is a combination of silver and gold. Total diamond weight approx. 0.20ct.
