A Minton & Co Nature series Aesthetic plate, circa 1875, retailed by Mortlock, decorated with a stork, impressed and black printed marks to base, diameter 26cm, together with a mixed group of similarly decorated tablewares, including two Minton Floral soup plates, decorated with vegetables, a graduated set of Doulton Burslem rectangular platters, a Moore & Co tazza, decorated with birds, and other 20th century decorative ceramics (faults and repairs).

Estimate: £60 - £100

Condition Report

Stork plate - small chip to upper rim edge at 12 o'clock with slight staining, minor rubbing to rim.
Two Minton Floral soup plates - one with 2 tiny nicks to rim and obviously used, other ok.
Graduated platters - largest crazed with 2 small nicks to base rim edge and two small haircracks to rim, larger middle size crazed and stained, smaller middle size generally ok, smallest heavily crazed and stained.
Turquoise ground vase - badly broken and riveted.
Rainbow Pottery vase - ok
Minton plate with chick on - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.
Plate with chicks in basket - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.
Plate with birds in nest - some scratches but otherwise ok.
Plate with 2 parrots - light staining but ok.
Plate with 2 birds by grass - crazed but ok.
Blue ground plate with 2 birds - crazed with some staining.
Plate with two birds on flowerpot - areas of wear to decoration, otherwise ok.
Tazza with 2 birds - restored stem, surface scratches.
Brangwyn vase - crazed but ok.
Shorter & Son jug - crazed with haircrack to foot.
Squat aesthetic vase - crazed with small enamel flake to one foot.
Bunnykins bowl - ok
Doulton flame bowl - badly cracked.
Shelley bowl - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.
Fish dish - crazed but ok.

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
