LOT 1142

A Chinese famille rose yellow ground porcelain vase and cover, mark of Qianlong but late Qing dynasty, the baluster body painted with opposing landscape panels reserved against a millefleurs-filled yellow ground, iron red four-character mark to base, height 26.5cm (repaired), together with three famille rose enamelled celadon ground circular dishes, diameters 19.5cm and 23cm (smaller dish with hairline).

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

1142. Vase - a large section of the body has been broken out and re-glued (approx 12.5cm x 8.5cm). This broken section also has a hairline crack to it. There is also a small chip to the footrim. Otherwise enamels are bright and vibrant.

The cover is in good condition with minor scuff to rim and minor wear to blue enamel on finial.

Small dish - star crack to centre. 5cm hairline crack to rim. Light surface scratches and wear to enamels.

Bird and flower decorated dish - glaze hairline to front (12cm long). Typical surface scratches and wear to glaze and enamels.

Densely decorated dish - minor chip to rim and glaze hairline to celadon ground. Typical surface scratches and wear to enamels.
