A garniture of three Stourbridge opalescent glass posy vases, probably John Walsh Walsh, late 19th century, modelled as yellow branches supporting clear opalescent vases, the tall central example with three vases, height 26.5cm, the outer pair each with a single vase, height 17cm, together with a similar single example and other decorative coloured glassware, including two paperweights (minor faults).

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

The opalescent branch posy vases are all in good condition overall, which is surprising considering their delicate nature and intricacy. The only issue is the largest which supports the 3 vases has a very small and indistinct internal crack to the solid part of the base - I would suggest this is a manufacturing issue.

The single cylindrical yellow example has numerous small chips to the relief nodules of the main body and losses to the tips of two of its feet.

The green/blue vaseline bark vase has similar chips to its relief nodules.

The top hat has a crack and small chip to the brim.

The roemer has a sizeable chip to the foot.

Otherwise all items in the lot are in good condition.
