A Chinese blue and white porcelain vase, mark of Qianlong but late Qing dynasty, the ovoid body painted with figures and pavilion, drilled through underglaze blue seal mark to base, height 23cm (repaired and faults), together with a Chinese blue and white vase, mark of Kangxi but late 19th century, painted with a figural scene, underglaze blue four-character mark to base, height 23cm (damaged and repaired), and a famille rose porcelain circular dish, diameter 16.5cm (chipped and cracked).

Condition Report

1184. Ovoid body base - small crack/bruise to rim, body is badly cracked with numerous hairlines running in different directions around the body. Drilled hole through mark to base with some chipping.

Narrow neck vase - chips to rim, U-shaped section of rim and neck broken out and re-glued (approx 5cm x 10cm in area). Also an impact crack to side of body and four hairline cracks running out into the body from this point. Both handles and base ok.

Dish - chip to rim (1.8cm x 2cm) and two hairlines to rim (1.2cm x 2cm long), typical wear and scratches.
