A pair of Chinese Canton famille verte porcelain vases and covers, late 19th century, each baluster body painted with a continuous scene of figures in a large pavilion and garden, each cover with Buddhistic lion finial, unmarked, height 38cm, together with a graduated pair of Japanese Imari circular bowls, diameters 18.5cm and 24cm (faults and repairs).

Condition Report

1122. Vase 1 - 2.5cm hairline to rim, otherwise generally good condition with typical light surface scratches and wear.

Cover 1 - chip to rim, otherwise ok with typical wear to enamels.

Vase 2 - 20cm vertical crack with three rivet repairs, also a horizontal crack running across the shoulder

(approx 17.5cm long), two other smaller hairlines to rim. Typical surface scratches and wear.

Cover 2 - three chips to rim and typical wear to enamels.

Larger bowl - generally good condition if a little dirty, some wear and scratches to interior.

Smaller bowl - 5cm crack across base and badly chipped footrim, otherwise bowl itself in generally good order. Typical surface scratches and wear.
