A Chinese blue and white export porcelain square tile, Kangxi period, painted with a circular panel of two birds flying above a blossoming branch and rocks, 13cm x 13cm, gilt framed, together with another blue and white porcelain square tile, painted with a figure crossing a bridge in a coastal landscape, 15cm x 15.5cm, framed. Provenance: from the private collection of David Armitage, former conservator to the Department of Eastern Art at the Ashmolean Museum, Oxford, between 1970 and 1999.

1016. Smaller tile appears to have a small repair to lower left corner, otherwise in good condition with typical light surface scratches to glaze.

Landscape tile in good condition with no apparent damage, typical light surface scratches and wear to glaze.
