A Chinese famille rose export porcelain teapot and cover, Qianlong period, the globular body painted with figures in landscape, height 13.2cm (hairline to handle), together with another Chinese famille rose export teapot and cover, the globular body painted with peony sprays, later applied with a silver scroll spout, height 13.4cm. Provenance: from the private collection of David Armitage, former conservator to the Department of Eastern Art at the Ashmolean Museum, Oxford, between 1970 and 1999.

Condition Report

1248. Teapot 1 - handle has been broken off and repaired, otherwise body and spout in good condition. Cover also in good condition, typical light surface scratches and wear to glaze and enamels.

Teapot 2 - handle has been broken and repaired, with some filler. Replacement spout and hairline crack running horizontally across either side of spout. Filled chip to rim and some minor chips to rim of cover. Enamels are bright and vibrant, typical light surface scratches and wear.
