A Chinese blue and white porcelain vase, mark of Kangxi but late 19th century, of baluster form, each side painted with a pair of boys supporting a large jar and cover against a prunus ground, underglaze blue four-character mark to base, height 26.7cm (minor chips), together with a Chinese blue and white cylindrical teapot, height 14.7cm (lacking cover), a large blue cylindrical vase, height 44cm (neck damaged), and a blue and white jar, height 14.7cm (lacking cover).

Condition Report

1034. Baluster vase - generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Small chip to rim and numerous nicks/chips/fritting to footrim. Light surface scratches to glaze.

Teapot - no cover. Small chip to tip of spout, otherwise good condition with no cracks or repairs. Typical light surface scratches to glaze.

Larger cylinder vase - broken and missing complete upper section/rim with other typical wear.

Jar - missing cover, otherwise good condition, no cracks, chips or repairs.
