A mixed group of mostly British pottery and porcelain, late 19th and 20th century, including a Worcester part tea service, decorated with Japanese style Aesthetic emblems, an Aynsley Orchard Fruit decorated plate and sucrier and cover, after Jones, a Belleek cream jug, two Greenland Falcons, modelled by Cicely Lushington, heights 19.5cm and 20.5cm, and a Copeland Spode Toby jug.

Condition Report

1417. Royal Worcester part set - generally good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

One of the saucers and some of the sideplates have light crazing and some light staining. Typical light surface wear and scratches to enamel.

Pair of ironstone plates - one with small chip to underside of rim, otherwise ok, light surface scratches.

Aynsley plate and sucrier - good condition.

2 Falcons - chipped tail feathers.

Green glazed jug and vase - good condition.

Copeland Toby jug - small chip to foot, light crazing and some minor staining.

Copeland blue and white sugar bowl - good condition.

3 Clarice Cliff cups - good condition.

Belleek jug - small chip to rim.

Grainger Worcester shell - good condition.

Doulton figure - good condition.

Silver mounted cup - good condition.
