A late 19th century French lacquered brass corniche cased carriage alarm clock by E.G. Lamaille, the eight day movement striking and repeating on a gong, the backplate with stamped 'E.G.L' maker's mark, the white enameled dial with black Roman hour numerals and subsidiary alarm dial, the glazed case with swing handle and bracket feet, height 17.5cm (parts of case loose).

Condition Report

1280. Both trains wind smoothly and it is currently running, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch.

The strike mechanism is working but is striking the wrong amounts on the hours so needs adjustment. The repeating mechanism is not currently working.

The case has typical surface scratches and wear and would benefit from a clean.

Glass panels have some chips to corners of front, back and one side panel. Some of them have dirty interiors so a clean is necessary.

It is missing a securing pin to one side of the handle which has made the handle and top of case loose, so this would need securing properly.

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
