### LOT 1705

A Dutch Delft lobed buckle dish, circa 1700, painted in blue and yellow with Chinese figures to the rim and centre within stylized foliate detail, diameter 21.5cm (riveted). Provenance: from the private collection of David Armitage, former conservator to the Department of Eastern Art at the Ashmolean Museum, Oxford, between 1970 and 1999.

### Condition Report

An approx one fifth section of the rim has been broken away in three pieces and visibly rivet repaired. There is some minor filling along the break lines. An associated haircrack runs from the repair towards the centre of the dish.

There is also a vertical crack to the rim almost opposite the repair, which runs from the edge towards the centre of the dish.

Typical fritting to the rim edge.

Some wear to the upper surface on the raised moulded areas.
